- U.S. Department of Defense ID
- Permanent resident card
- Border crossing card
- An acceptable photo ID issued by a federally recognized Tribal Nation/Indian Tribe, including Enhanced Tribal Cards
- HSPD-12 PIV card
- Foreign government-issued passport
- Canadian provincial driver's license or Indian and Northern Affairs Canada Card
- Transportation worker identification credential
- U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services Employment Authorization Card
- U.S Merchant Mariner Credential
- Veteran Health Identification Card
